Teaching It Like It Is - FLO

Relationships & Sexual Health Education Course

For educators working with young people in alternative education settings (e.g. Flexible Learning Options (FLO) providers, Independent Learning Centres, Better Behaviour Centres etc)

This 2-day workshop explores topics that would be part of a comprehensive relationships and sexual health program for secondary students. Focusing on an alternative education setting, content will include teaching methods, up-to-date sexual health information and statistics, a range of resources, practical demonstrations and activities, and curriculum outlines that are mapped to the *Australian Curriculum* and Department for Education's *Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum*.

This course provides opportunity for discussion with other educators in similar contexts on how to be proactive about Relationships and Sexual Health education from a positive strength based approach. You will explore strategies for responding to attitudes and values that can be harmful or limiting to students' knowledge, skills and capacity to recognise and make effective decisions in relation to their own and others' relationships and sexual health. Topics include:

- respecting difference
- puberty / reproductive system
- contraception and pregnancy
- impact of gender
- relationships

- safer sex
- sexual diversity
- relationship violence
- media, pornography and technology
- responding to sexualised behaviour
